Introduction to formal Query Management

- The process under the **Capacity Market Code** (CMC) is different from that outlined for the Trading & Settlement Code.
- The CMC does not envisage a formal query process in the same manner as that set out in the
 Trading & Settlement Code due to the nature of the issues being covered.
- The TSC deals mostly with ex-post settlement and items that may be recalculated up to thirteen months after the original delivery date.
- The CMC deals with ex-ante processes that happen in advance of delivery, i.e. pre-auction events such as **qualification**.
- The timelines that support the CMC processes drive a stricter process and do not provide for the long ex-post timelines (e.g., post M+13) that settlement can support.
